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to historians and philosophers of education, is arranged in a highly accessible format. These are capsule overviews of the subject's life and significance, which can serve as a spring-board for further biographical research. Further, this book contains useful cross references, printed in bold letters, to other educators treated in the volume who appear in a particular entry.

A minor inconsistency in the entries relates to the identification of the subject's parents. Most entries identify the subject's parents by name. In some instances, however, such as that of Jane Addams, the biographical sketch says she was the "daughter of a wealthy miller and railroad builder." (p. 5) Although often a tedious task for authors and editors of biographical dictionaries to compile, such information is helpful to those using this kind of reference work. This reviewer recalls spending long hours in tracking down such information in response to copy editors' queries.

The entries are typically accurate in facts and interpretation. The entry for Marietta Louise Pierce Johnson, however, incorrectly states that she was born at Fairhope, Alabama (p. 261). Johnson was born on October 8, 1864, in St. Paul, Minnesota. The Single Tax Colony at Fairhope, the site of Johnson's School of Organic Education, was not established until 1894.

Most of the leading educators of nineteenth- and twentieth-century Europe and North America appear in the book. There are some considered significant by this reviewer, however, who are absent. Robert Owen, the British utopian and communitarian educator, and William Maclure, the philanthropist who promoted Pestalozzianism in the United States, do not appear. Perhaps, the authors considered their major contributions as lying in the eighteenth rather than nineteenth century. However, Pestalozzi (1746-1827), whose career spanned both centuries is included. Entries for H.G. Wells, Theodore Brameld, and George S. Counts also are missing. These minor criticisms, however, should not detract from the book's overall contribution as a valuable reference work in the history of education.

The book contains selected illustrations such as images of certain subjects and title pages from some of their books. The addition of a table of contents or an index would have been helpful to users for ease in locating subjects in the book.
